

# Hunger-Free Schools in Maryland

## 2016-2017 School Year

The Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) allows high poverty schools to provide free breakfast and lunch to all students – essentially becoming Hunger-Free Schools. More than 98,200 students in Maryland attend one of the following 229 *Hunger-Free Schools*. Schools marked with an asterisk (\*) are new CEP schools for the 2016-2017 school year.
