

# Hunger-Free Schools in Maryland

## 2017-2018 School Year

The Community Eligibility Provision is a federal school meal funding option that allows high poverty schools to provide access to free breakfast and lunch to all students.

The following **242 Hunger-Free Schools** with more than **103,500 students** currently participate, including 19 schools that are new for the 2017-2018 school year and are marked with an asterisk.
