

## Community Eligibility Creates Hunger-Free Schools

Community eligibility allows schools with a high percentage of low-income students to provide access to free school breakfast and lunch to all students — essentially becoming **Hunger-Free Schools**.

In the 2016-2017 school year, 229 Maryland schools participated in community eligibility and as a result, more than 98,000 students attended a Hunger-Free School. However, more than 160 additional schools in Maryland are eligible to elect the Community Eligibility Provision. In fact, the entire school districts of **Allegany, Dorchester**, and **Wicomico** counties are eligible to join Baltimore City and Somerset County Public Schools in adopting community eligibility district-wide.

In addition, the 26 Maryland schools listed on the following page are eligible at the highest reimbursement rate — meaning that if they elect community eligibility, at least 90 percent of all school meals served will be reimbursed by the federal government at the highest rate. These "highly eligible" schools include:

- Five schools in Dorchester County
- Five in Wicomico County
- Three in Allegany County
- Three in Anne Arundel County
- Three in Caroline County

One school in each of the following counties is also highly eligible, but not currently participating:

- Baltimore County
- Cecil County
- Frederick County
- Harford County
- Montgomery County
- St. Mary's County

The deadline for new schools to elect community eligibility for the coming school year is June 30, 2017.
